1. What does the word omnipresence mean?

Presence in every place at the same time; unbounded or universal presence. Omnipresence is an attribute peculiar to God.

2. What did Christ have prepared for Him when He came to earth? Hebrews 10:5

3. What type of body was it? Hebrews 2:16

If He took the nature of Abraham then He could not be everywhere at the same time, therefore when Christ came to earth He gave up His ability to be everywhere at the same time.

4. What about after He rose from the grave? Luke 24:38, 39

Christ still had the same body that was prepared for Him, therefore when Christ rose from the dead He did not have the ability to be everywhere at the same time.

5. What type of Christ rose to heaven in full view of the disciples? Acts 1:11

The angel said the SAME Jesus. Nothing different about Christ

6. While He is in heaven what does the Bible say that Christ is doing? Hebrews 7:25

Jesus cares for each one as though there were not another individual on the face of the earth. As Deity He exerts mighty power in our behalf, while as our Elder Brother He feels for all our woes.
